After clearing customs and collecting your luggage, you will be met in the arrivals hall by a representative from **ARABIAN ORYX**, who will be holding a signboard with your name on it.

The citv of Dubai has records from 1799 when traditional activities included herding sheep and cultivating dates. goats. fishing and pearling, but the inhabitants built up trade By the turn of the too. century, Dubai was reputed to have the largest souks on



the Gulf coast, with 350 shops in the Deira district alone. On the British withdrawal in 1971, Dubai came together with Abu Dhabi, Sharjah, Ajman, Umm Al Quwain, Fujairah and (in 1972) Ras Al Khaimah to create the federation of the United Arab Emirates. The



discovery of oil in 1966 transformed the emirate and its way of life and, what once was a small desert trading post, has emerged as one of the fastest growing, luxurious and affluent cities in the world today. Buildings sprout more quickly than anyone could imagine and every day it seems there is more to see and do – including relaxing on its superb beaches, shopping at its magnificent retail centres (and traditional souks) as well as enjoying the city's exciting nightlife.

You will then be transferred to Jemeirah Zabeel Saray for breakfast. Please contact Mr Ross Park on +971 56 676 9364 upon arrival.

At approximately 9.00 am, embark on a private half day city tour, giving you an interesting insight into both the past and present of this fascinating city. You will see some of Dubai's magnificent and prominent landmarks from iconic buildings to museums and the infamous Dubai Creek



which is the pulse and lifeline of the city.

At the conclusion of your tour at approximately 1.30 pm, you will be transferred to the Jumeirah Beach Hotel to check-in, and enjoy some time at leisure.

7.00 pm You will be collected from your hotel for this evening's Dhow Dinner Cruise.

Experience the true beauty of Dubai onboard a traditional wooden dhow, on a two hour cruise in Dubai Creek under the moonlight and stars. Witness the magnificence of the city at night as you enjoy a buffet dinner and traditional Arabic coffee, accompanied by soft Arabic music to set the mood.

Upon arrival at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport you, Leanne and Leith will be met airside and assisted with your Customs and Immigration formalities, and collection of your luggage. You will then be escorted to the Arrivals Hall where the three of you will be warmly welcomed by a member of the **&Beyond** team and transferred to your hotel – approximately a 60 minute transfer.

Kirstine, Kristina and Jenny will be arriving into Nairobi on Kenya Airways flight KQ 413 from Entebbe, scheduled to arrive at 4.00 pm. They will then be transferred directly from the airport to the Palacina Suites.

Nairobi, Kenya's mile-high capital is only 138 km south of the equator. Located in an area once frequented by the pastoral Masai, Nairobi was founded by the British in 1899 as a supply depot for the Uganda Railway which was being constructed between Mombasa and Uganda and soon became the railway's headquarters. It was named after



a water hole known in Maasai as Ewaso Nyirobi, meaning "cool waters". Now the city has a population of more than 3 million and is the largest city between Cairo and Johannesburg. It's a modern commercial centre with some interesting high-rises and lots of bustle. But its national park is one of the most important and famous attractions. The Nairobi National Park is home to over 50 rhinos who were moved from locations where poaching was widespread. There are more than 80 species of mammals including gazelle, buffalo, warthogs, lion, cheetah, zebra, giraffe and ostrich. More than 550 bird species can also be found in this park.

Upon arrival at the airstrip in Meru National Park, you will be met and transferred to the spectacular Elsa's Kopje Lodge, named after Elsa the lioness made famous by George and Joy Adamson's biographical book and film "Born Free".





Elsa's Kopje is renowned for being one of the most elegant lodges in Africa, with a spectacular setting. It is the best upmarket location from which to view rhino in their natural habitat in Kenya. The lodge is almost invisible to the eye as you approach its home on Mughwango Hill. It blends into the rocky crags of the "kopje" (small hill), built above the site of George Adamson's original campsite. Every cottage is the ultimate 'room-with-a-view', uniquely designed and crafted, incorporating the natural features of the rocky hillside. Each cottage is spacious with an elegantly appointed ensuite bathroom. There is an open bar, lounge and dining room with an exceptionally inviting infinity pool overlooking the Meru plains.

Meru National Park

Straddling the equator and bisected by 13 rivers and numerous mountain-fed streams, Meru National Park is an especially beautiful area of Kenya. It has diverse scenery from woodlands at 3,000 feet on the slopes of Nyambeni Mountain Range, northeast of Mount Kenya, to



wide open plains with wandering riverbanks dotted with doum palms. Game to view includes: elephant, cheetah, leopard and some of the rarer antelopes - Lesser Kudu, duiker and Dik Dik, one of Africa's smallest antelopes. Large prides of lion can be seen and some of Kenya's largest herds of buffalo. The rivers abound with hippo and crocodile. In the mid 1980's, the Park suffered from poaching, however Kenya Wildlife Service armed wildlife security patrols have driven out the poachers and the elephant population has stabilised with breeding herds settling down. Over 300 species of birds have been recorded including the Peter's Finfoot which inhabits the Murera and Ura Rivers, the Pel's Fishing Owl, kingfishers, rollers, bee-eaters, starlings and numerous weavers. The Park is most famous as the setting for Joy Adamson's book "Born Free" - the story of the Adamson's life and research amongst lion and cheetah. "Elsa" the lioness was the most well-known and her grave is marked here.

Enjoy a full day at Elsa's Kopje Lodge. Activities available include day and night game drives, guided bush walks, bush meals, sundowners, cultural visits, line fishing (catfish and barbel), swimming pool and massages.

Please note: Kenya Wildlife Service charges a supplement of US\$20.00 per person for each night game drive and/or guided game walk whilst staying at Elsa's Kopje.



Fri 25 Meru National Park > Masai Mara

On arrival into the airstrip you will be met by a representative from Elephant Pepper Camp and transfer with fellow guests to camp.

Elephant Pepper Camp is situated in the middle of the protected Mara North Conservancy wilderness area. Small and exclusive, the camp is located away from other lodges, in the heart of the African bush. The spacious canvas tents are comfortably furnished, featuring en suite



bathrooms with eco-friendly flush toilets and traditional safari showers. Nothing rivals sitting around the campfire enjoying the sounds of the African night. Extended game drives make game viewing a complete experience. Elephant Pepper Camp brings people back to nature – no traffic, no permanent structures, just the sights and sounds of the African bush.





Probably the most famous of the reserves, the Masai Mara, in Kenya's southwestern corner, boasts an astonishing amount of game. Unfenced, the Mara is bounded in the east by the Ngama Hills and in the west by the Oloololo or Siria Escarpment. Gazelle, wildebeest and zebra

graze in large numbers and where prey is found so are predators. Not only is this a great place in which to find game, but also the wide greeny-gold savannahs dotted with thorn trees make it ideal for photography. The Mara, as it is known in Kenya, is ravishingly beautiful and also offers long, undisturbed views and utterly dramatic panoramas. The weather also really means something here: the sun may beat down unforgivingly, huge clouds in fabulous shapes may sweep across the widest of skies; the wind ripples the grasses as though a giant hand strokes them. The landscape is stunning.

This morning you will be collected from Elephant Pepper Camp and transferred through to & Beyond Bateleur Camp – a drive of approximately two hours with game viewing en-route.





Experience classic safari stvle. where wildlife adventures by day blend with elegant panache under canvas at night, at Bateleur sweeping Camp. With views over some of the premier viewing game regions in the world, this intimate camp reflects the ambiance of the Kenvan

explorers of the 20s and 30s. Verdant branches that open up onto an expansive panorama provide endless views of the Masai Mara as soon as you open your eyes in your vast timber bed. Let the untouched landscapes take you back to the style and glamour of vintage Africa. Slip into a world of hardwood floors, polished silver and sparkling crystal juxtaposed against the romance of the open Mara plains, with their abundant herds of wildlife.

This afternoon enjoy exploring the Masai Mara on a scheduled game drive from & Beyond Bateleur Camp. The reserve is one of the few places where it is possible to see the 'Big Five'. The term 'Big Five' refers to lion, elephant, buffalo, leopard and rhinoceros and was coined by big-game hunters as the five most difficult animals in Africa to hunt on foot. Although it is best known for its annual Great Migration of more than two million wildebeest and thousands of Thomson's gazelle, zebra and impala, game-viewing remains excellent throughout the year. For the bird enthusiast 500 species have been recorded. It is also wellknown for its spectacular black-maned lion and for up-close-andpersonal cheetah sightings.

Situated in the & Beyond Kichwa Tembo Private Concession, which neighbours the Masai Mara, & Beyond Bateleur Camp offers worldclass accommodation in the African bush. Meaning "head of the elephant" in Kiswahili, Kichwa Tembo is located on private land leased from Maasai landlords in the remote western Mara – almost exclusively explored by fly-in guests. In addition to the excellent concentration of



animals, Kichwa Tembo lies directly in the path of Africa's spectacular Great Migration.

Upon your arrival, you will be met by a member of the &Beyond Ngorongoro Crater Lodge team who will transfer you with fellow guests to the Lodge – approximately two hours within the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, home to the World Heritage Site of the Ngorongoro Crater.

Ngorongoro Crater Lodge is perched on the edge of this world-famous crater. It lies within the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, which covers more than 8,000 km² of pristine African wilderness. Inspired in design by the Maasai mud-andstick manyatta (homestead), Ngorongoro Crater Lodge is



without doubt one of the most architecturally spectacular safari lodges in Africa. Each stilted, handcrafted mud and thatch suite is adorned with graceful antiques and grand chandeliers. The bedroom, sitting room and en suite bathroom boast floor-to-ceiling glass windows, overlooking the magnificent crater below. En suite bathrooms, feature huge showers and chandelier-lit bathtubs. Personal butlers discreetly tend to guests' every need, bringing tea in bed, stoking fireplaces and drawing luxurious baths. Described as "Maasai meets Versailles", each camp has its own guest sitting and dining areas and viewing decks. The domed dining room, with its grand fireplace, turns every meal into a special occasion.

Ngorongoro Crater



In the Great Rift Valley, that great schism in the earth's crust, lies the wonderful Ngorongoro Crater - one of the wonders of the natural world that was created when an extinct volcano collapsed in on itself forming a vast super bowl where the largest permanent concentration of African game is on display. The central bowl, the caldera, has sides roughly 1,950 feet high and a flattish centre with a diameter of about ten miles. *The views from the top of the crater wall are absolutely breath-taking.* The crater walls are forested but four wheel drive vehicles will take you down into this primeval paradise of woodland, lake, river, swamp and plain that shelters around 20,000 animals. Many of these are the large grazing animals such as wildebeest, buffalo, gazelle and zebra that depend on the open grasslands in the crater. These attract the attendant predators - the black-maned lion, the leopard and hyena. Elephants found within the caldera tend to be the lone males who have left the herds in the forested crater rim. When the water stocks are low elsewhere the animals within this micro-world turn to the swamps for fresh water and food. Elephants feed on the giant sedges and hippo wallow in the pools. The Fever Tree forests shelter monkeys, bushbuck and waterbuck and the few black rhino that have taken refuge here. A soda lake, fed by the Munge River attracts water birds, including flamingos and is a favourite place for predators to make their kill. Wildly beautiful as it is, it is not surprising that Ngorongoro Crater has been called a "Garden of Eden".





Today descend the steep walls of the crater to admire the microcosms of life within A UNESCO World it. Heritage Site, this unique biosphere has remained virtually unchanged since the dawn of time. Deep within crater. enclosed the bv towering walls, some 25,000 large mammals wander the

plains, lakes and forests of 'the land that time forgot', dominated by enormous bull elephants, rhinos and lions. Here, you'll often see four of the 'Big Five' with ease.

Tue 29Ngorongoro > Serengeti National ParkB,L,D

This morning you will be transferred with fellow guests back to Manyara Airstrip.

8.35 am Depart MANYARA AIRSTRIP on Tanganyika Flying Company

Upon your arrival at Lobo Airstrip (mid morning), you will be met by a member of the &Beyond Klein's Camp team who will transfer you with

fellow guests to the Lodge – approximately 90 minutes by game drive.

Set just below the crest of the Kuka Hills, Klein's Camp overlooks the vital corridor linking the Serengeti and the Masai Mara. Twice a year, the valleys below are filled with a jostling throng of





zebra and wildebeest. Sweeping views of the surrounding valleys and hills provide hours of endless entertainment, with resident giraffe and elephant often spotted moving leisurely on the nearby slopes. The camp's thatched cottages with whitewashed walls and rich wooden floors look down to the valleys below. The stone interiors of the guest areas open up to breathtaking panoramas and deep leather armchairs invite you to while away the midday hours. In the evening, you can gather around blazing fireplaces to share the adventures of the day. Fine linen, silver and china sparkle in the candlelight of the open dining areas, while mouth-watering aromas drift through from the camp kitchen.

The 14,763 square kilometres of the Serengeti are probably most famous for being the southern end of the Great Migration. Every year over 1.5 million animals, mostly wildebeest but also Zebra and Thompson's gazelle, follow their instincts and move through the western corridor on their 1,000 kilometre journey to the fresh grazing of the Masai Mara. Predators pick off the weak, the laggardly and the

young and crocodiles feast as the vast herd crosses the rivers but they continue their trek, as they have done since time immemorial. This is one of the earth's great sights - but it is by no means all the Serengeti has to offer. The vast, flat central plains, are made fertile by the ashes of the volcanoes



of the Ngongoro highlands. This is a place of huge skies, of shimmering heat hazes, yet also of delicate wild flowers blooming after the rains. The savannah, sprinkled with Acacia Tortilis, has majestic termite mounds and rock formations called kopjes which make great vantage points for predators. The lion are abundant, the leopard are plentiful (yet still secretive) and black rhino and cheetah both breed here. There are more than 500 species of bird and, interestingly, 100 sub-species of dung beetle - a sign of a varied animal population! Ndutu, in the south, has small lakes where you may see hippo and water



birds. Perhaps one of the best ways to see the Serengeti is a hot air balloon ride when, in the cool of the early morning, you may admire the grandeur, the vastness and the stunning landscape.

Enjoy your exploration of the endless plains of the Serengeti on early morning and late afternoon/evening game drives in an open 4x4 safari vehicle. When the Great Migration moves through the Klein's Camp area, game drives will concentrate on the massed herds and the various carnivores that accompany



them. Klein's Camp is also the only lodge in the Serengeti to offer night drives, which allows you to experience the nocturnal world of the mighty hunters and predators.

In between morning and afternoon game drives explore the sights, smells and sounds of the African bush on a leisurely walk in the surrounds of the camp, accompanied by an armed guide and Maasai tracker. On these walks you may encounter mountain reedbuck, klipspringer and rock hyrax on the rocky slopes surrounding Klein's Camp. Majestic birds of prey can be seen soaring high above on the strong thermals of the Serengeti.

Upon arrival into Zanzibar International Airport you will be met by a representative from & Beyond team and transferred to your hotel located in Stone Town, approximately 20 minutes by road.

Zanzibar is an island steeped in culture and history а destination which brought adventurers. seafarers and traders from far and wide. The Zanzibar archipelago is set in the Indian Ocean and made up of the larger islands of Pemba and Unguja (also called Zanzibar



Island). Zanzibar is also known as the 'Spice Island' due to the delicious variety of spices grown on island's many plantations. Stone Town, a World Heritage Site, boasts a labyrinth of winding alleys, bustling marketplaces, beautifully carved wooden doors, breathtaking



mosques and grand Arab residences. Another must-see attraction on Zanzibar includes the Jozani Forest Reserve - home to the rare Kirk's red colobus monkey and Aders' duiker.
